**MCpl Yang is wearing the Service Dress 1A.** The badges represent the history of The Royal Canadian Corps of

Signals and the C&E Branch. The

Canadian Corps of signals was established on October 24th, 1903. The early insignia were crossed flags reminding us of the crossed lances of the 21<sup>st</sup> Lancers, the unit of our our first commanding officer. Our cap badge is now the C&E Branch badge issued in 1968 with the image of the roman god "Mercury:' adopted from the Royal Signals with the lightning bolts and blue background added by the Branch. Mercury is the messenger of the Roman gods, patron of travellers and the badge of military signals throughout the Commonwealth. The Midnight Blue beret,

first issued in 1951 was reintroduced in 2019. On the shoulder, are the letters **RCCS** proudly representing Royal Canadian Corps of Signals. Below, on the upper arm is the Tower Badge granted to members of 32 Canadian Brigade Group in 1997 and symbolizing strength and industry. MCpl Yang is wearing lapel badges, introduced in 1968 showing "Mercury". In 2021, in keeping with our history, the crossed flags of the RCCS have been reintroduced for the uniform lapel badge. On the lower right sleeve MCpl Yang wears his Trade Badge. Crossed Signalling flags are for Signaller Development

Period (DP) 1. Crossed flags with Oak leaves are for DP 2, Corporal. Crossed flags with crown are Master Corporal and crossed flags with Crown and Oakleaves are for Sergeant.
